Dear Parent/Carer,

Thank you for choosing Ysgol Llanhari for your child's secondary education. We are very much looking forward to welcoming your child as an official member of 'Teulu Llanhari' in September!

Following this year's successful transition days, your child has had a taste of life at Llanhari along with opportunities to get to know some of the staff and other pupils. We hope that your child has benefited from these experiences and feels confident about starting secondary school in September.

It is important that pupils fully comply with the expectations set for every pupil in the school. This pack outlines these expectations and we kindly ask that you discuss these with your child before he/she starts with us in September. This information has also been shared with the pupils during our transition days.

Medical Information

If there is any medical information that we need to be aware of before the first day that you have not yet shared, please contact Mr John Rivers, Year 7 Progress Leader on post@llanhari.cymru as soon as possible.

Should your child's medical condition require staff to be able to identify him/her immediately in September, then we kindly ask you to send an electronic photo of your child. All parents will be asked to complete a detailed medical form in September.



Times of the Day

School starts at 8.30am and finishes at 3.00pm. Pupils will receive 5 lessons, each 60 minutes long every day, together with pastoral/tutor time at 8.35am. Please note the schedule below:

Necessary Equipment

All pupils are expected to bring the following equipment to school every day:

- Pen
- Pencil
- Coloured pencils
- Eraser
- Sharpener
- Ruler
- Calculator (Scientific if possible)
- Protractor
- Compass

It is a good idea to label all of your child's belongings in order to facilitate the search for missing items.

Mobile Phones and Electronic Equipment

Pupils are allowed to bring mobile phones to school if you as parents/guardians are happy for your child to do so, but the phone must be turned off in lessons and in the corridors and kept at the bottom of the bag. If pupils break this rule, teachers will take their phones and transfer it to the school office, to be returned at the end of the day. The school does not accept responsibility for any mobile phones lost or damaged in or on the way to/from school, or on educational visits.



If a pupil's phone is taken on three occasions within the same half term to the school office, then we kindly ask the parents to come and pick it up. It will not be returned to the pupil.

Lost Property

Over the past year, the number of items left at school by pupils has increased significantly. An attempt is made to return items to their owners but as most items do not have names on them, it is impossible to return them to the correct owner. You are therefore asked to ensure that each item of school uniform is labelled with your child's name so that it can be immediately identified and returned to your child if it goes missing. Items left by pupils can be found in the school office.

School Transport

Transport to and from the school is arranged by Rhondda Cynon Taf transport department. They will send your child's bus pass to your home address during the summer holidays. **Pupils must have their bus pass on every journey.** Any queries should be directed to:

If you intend to collect your child from school by car at the end of the day we ask that you respect other parents who are doing the same and take care of pupils who are leaving the site at 3 o'clock.

Payment Arrangements

The school uses Rhondda Cynon Taf's cashless system in order so that parents can pay for any items that are relevant to the school (eg Uniform, Lunch Money, Trips, Instrumental Lessons, etc). You will receive a login code at the start of the academic year.

Dinner Money

Pupils will receive advice on how to use the canteen's biometric system during the first morning. As it will not be possible for you to make an online payment until your child is on the school register in September, we kindly ask you to provide them with a packed lunch for the first two days. Around £3.50-£4.00 will be enough to buy a lunchtime meal. Toast and refreshments are also served during break times. We encourage all pupils to bring a water bottle to school every day and fill it from the water fountains when necessary.



Communication with parents – Bromcom

In September we will invite you to register for our communication system, Bromcom. All correspondence from the school and external agencies will shared through this website. For convenience, the 'My Child at School' app can be downloaded to your mobile phone.

The app will also show an up to date record of your child's attendance, their timetable, a record of homework tasks together with the number of credit/behaviour points your child has received. You will also be able to notify us of your child's absence by using the app.

Learning and Registration Groups

Pupils will be placed in mixed ability learning groups in September considering a variety of factors, including friendship groups, additional needs required and social skills. Your child's registration class will be shared on the last transition day.

Extracurricular Activities

The social aspects of school life are also important. They provide an opportunity for pupils to experience "living through Welsh" and extend their ability in the language by using it in a variety of situations. It develops all facets of the pupil's character and personality while offering experiences and promoting social skills beyond the classroom. A variety of activities are organized during lunchtime and after school, including sports and YEPS activities. We will share more details and a timetable in September. Pupils and parents are often informed of weekly activities on the school's Twitter and Instagram accounts.

APPENDIX 2 - SCHOOL UNIFORM

LLANHARI SCHOOL UNIFORM GUIDELINES

- Ysgol Llanhari black polo shirt
- Llanhari's official red Sweatshirt, which includes the school badge
- Trousers
 Black school trousers, straight legged with a loose hemline.
 Tight, 'skinny' trousers, leggings or jeans are not permitted.





• **Skirt**Plain black, knee length skirt. The skirt needs to be a sensible length





Socks / Tights
 Black or white socks with black trousers
 Thick black tights with skirt



School Coats

A dark black or blue coat. There should not be large logos on the coat. Pupils are not permitted to wear coats in the classroom. Please note that hoodies (which are not school hoodies), are not permitted in school.

Shoes

Flat black leather school shoes. **<u>Trainers are not permitted</u>**



Pupils are not permitted to wear

- Makeup
- Jewellery (necklace, bracelet, nose studs) apart from ear studs.
- Painted, fake or acrylic nails

• Hair

A natural hair style and colour is expected. Hairstyles should be sensible and suitable for the workplace.

If pupils do not have the correct school uniform, then we will be contacting you as parents to ask for your cooperation to ensure the correct standard of uniform.



PART B - PHYSICAL EDUCATION UNIFORM GUIDELINES

Pupils must ensure they have the correct uniform in every lesson.

- The school's Physical Education shirt
- The school's red quarter zip PE top
- Plain BLACK shorts without a logo. Short shorts such as Nike Pro shorts are not permitted.
- Plain black socks or the school's rugby socks for games / extracurricular
- activities
- A pair of shoes suitable for running and games on hard surfaces.
